#### Senior Pastor's Report Pastor Kendall Koenig, Senior Pastor



2023 was a strong year for Light of Christ as we continued to move forward from the disruption of the pandemic and more fully living out our mission and living into our amazing new space. God keeps leading us in and through the opportunities and challenges that arise. This year was another testimony to His faithfulness!

In the following pages of this annual report, you can read about the important ministry LOC was a part of this past year - gathering for worship, connecting and discipling children, youth, and adults, and serving powerfully in the community. So

much great work by so many wonderful staff and amazing lay leaders! And I am blessed to have a pastoral partner like Pastor Mo with her many gifts. I am so grateful for the way you as the people of LOC continue to live out our mission to Invite, Nurture, and Serve with such passion.

Here are some other highlights from the year that may not be captured by those individual ministry areas...

- 1) Our teams of Care callers continued to reach out to people in the congregation who have expressed prayer needs or who hadn't been able to connect in worship for a while. Kindness and care were shared!
- 2) We hosted an Artisan Faire, welcoming the community into our space, raising funds for Kids in Need in McHenry County, and for our ASP mission trip.
- 3) We celebrated Bonnie's almost 25 years of ministry among us in May and welcomed Yvette Butler into that important role of Director of Adult and Serving Ministry.
- 4) We dedicated our Memorial Garden as a beautiful place for people to pray and reflect and where the ashes of the saints can be interred until Christ's return.
- 5) Our Endowment Team launched the first Estate Planning workshop in November, as the Council has agreed to provide Philanthrocorp's estate planning services to everyone in the congregation.
- 6) We baptized 31 children, youth, and adults, and confirmed 18 young people.
- 7) I had the privilege to marry 7 couples connected to LOC and the privilege to commend into Christ's care 13 people who God called home.
- 8) We paid down another \$300K on our mortgage this year. In the past three years, since we moved into this beautiful space, through our mortgage payments and extra payments, we have paid off more than a quarter of our mortgage!
- 9) All of that and more while making a <u>weekly</u> impact on the lives of...
  - a. Around 200 children through our Preschool, FaithLand, and Wednesday Night Live, and
  - b. Around 100 middle school and high school youth through Path and Summit,
  - c. Almost 200 adults engaged in Small Groups throughout the week,
  - d. And more as we gathered for worship and serve in the community!

Light of Christ is alive and thriving as the Holy Spirit is at work, drawing people to Christ and to each other. It is my privilege to continue to serve as your pastor in this vibrant community of faith!

# Associate Pastor's Report

As I've been reflecting on this past year and all that God has been doing through Light of Christ, I can't help but feel blessed to serve alongside such amazing people, who give their heart and soul to "being" the Light of Christ, not only in our Church doors but



beyond our walls, through prayers for one another, volunteering at food pantries, hosting mobile food trucks, tutoring kids through our Branching Out program, making homes safer, warmer, and dryer through ASP, providing yard work for shut-ins, buying Christmas presents for families in need, or just jumping in to offer a helping hand. With each passing year, I spend serving and leading within this community (it's been 3 now!), I fall more in love with all of you! Thank you for being such a warm and welcoming community, who truly meets people where they're at. This type of "being" in the world is priceless for God's Kingdom and I'm excited to see what God will do through us as we walk in faith together!

As I sat down to write this annual report, I realized there was no way that I would be able to cover all that's happened in the life of LOC this year—but here are a few amazing highlights from the ministries I've been fortunate to supervise.

**ONLINE** As a part of our Ignite initiative we felt God moving us to invest into what it means to "be the church," online, understanding that the internet is an amazing tool to live out the Great Commission of making followers of Jesus. Imagine how many people Paul could have reached with the love of Christ if he had the internet! This platform has grown exponentially, and we are now reaching over 10,000 people locally on Facebook because of your comments, shares, and likes. THANK YOU! Our Tech Director Jack Belford has done an amazing job at building a YouTube channel where we now provide over 350 videos (sermons, testimonies, devotionals) and have almost 400 subscribers. We've also recently started filming a Live Podcast called, *Unpacking Truths*, where Pastor Kendall and I will be discussing relevant and hot topics within our culture while unpacking God's truth to be discovered within them. We will be releasing this sometime in 2024 so keep your eyes open and consider supporting God's mission field online by subscribing to our channels!

**YOUTH** Our PATH confirmation program welcomed in a new PATH Direction, Candi Neely, who has been such a gift from God, as she graciously shares her high-energy, enthusiasm, and love for the Lord in extremely fun and creative ways with our Jr. High youth. It wasn't easy saying goodbye to our previous Director of 12 years, Jared Skorburg, but we wished him well and our youth prayed over him during his "happy retirement celebration."

Summit, our High School Ministry, continues to flourish as we provide youth with a sacred space, they feel loved as they discover their value in Christ. We are blessed to have welcomed three amazing new leaders this year and our teens have been joyfully serving at our new quarterly serving opportunities that have been added to our program this year.

**CHILDREN** This year I've had some opportunities to hang out with our children during our Wednesday Night Live weekday program and our Sunday program, FaithLand. It's always a delight to be around children! They constantly remind me of God's joy as they smile, dance, freely share about their lives and boisterously sing praises to Jesus! We are incredibly blessed to have Directors of our Children's ministries who give 110% to our children. They understand just how precious the development of our children's faith is and their knowledge of God's love for them. To grow these ministries that offer precious opportunities for our children, we've decided to focus on building up our volunteer base in 2024. There is no greater gift than to share the love of Jesus with our future through serving in the Children's ministry! **POLICE CHAPLAIN** I am thankful for the opportunity God has given us to grow in the ministries that support our wider community. Being a local Police Chaplain for Algonquin has been both challenging and life giving this year. As I reflect on the past year, there is so much to celebrate and praise the Lord for. The unceasing generosity that this community of Christians continues to pour into our church mission is nothing short of extraordinary. The LOC mission of Inviting people into Christian community, Nurture them in a life-changing relationship with Jesus, so we can Serve Him is constantly on display through your willingness to share your resources of time, talent, and treasure. During every Council meeting we recite our mission statement to remind us that the discussions and discernment we are about to embark on are for His glory.

As we continued in our Ignite campaign, many goals that the Council had set forth for 2023 have been accomplished. The beautiful Memorial Garden with its striking cross and arbor

were dedicated in the Fall. Thanks to the Team that worked hard to create this place for us to celebrate those who have gone to be with our Creator. The Endowment Fund was launched in November by the Endowment Team and featured an estate planning workshop. Our online ministry continues to grow and find new ways to bring the word of God to the broader community. In addition, through the continued financial generosity of LOC members and attendees we were able to pay down a significant portion of our mortgage, support YoungLife locally and more globally Lutheran World Relief. We are truly living in our newly adopted One-Fund financial model.

This year the Council had to wrestle with the difficult topic of the viability of the Saturday service. The council spent several meetings in deep discussion and conversation on this topic. In addition, time was spent with the key leaders of the Saturday service to gather their input and perspective. After much discernment and prayer, the difficult decision was made to discontinue the Saturday service. It is through these thoughtful decisions that LOC continues to thrive. Thanks to those (*you know who you are*) that made the Saturday service possible for so long. It's wonderful to see our Saturday night brothers and sisters on Sundays now!

This year LOC celebrated some significant events. After 24 years of serving Light of Christ as the Director of Adult Ministries, we celebrated Bonnie Kautz-Prasse's retirement. Bonnie, thank you for your commitment, enthusiasm, and love for Jesus that you exemplified each day. Happy retirement! If that was not enough, we also celebrated the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the E3 (Explore. Engage. Experience.) adult faith journey weekend that has transformed so many lives. Finally, we have welcomed dozens of new members to the LOC family, welcome to all our new members!

We also welcomed new staff members. Yvette Butler joined us as our new Director of Adult and Serving Ministries and Candi Neely as our new PATH Coordinator. Thank you for answering God's calling, we are blessed to have you!

As my term on Council comes to a close, it has been an been an amazing three years. From the tough discussions and decisions to the events and celebrations, it has been a blessing. Special thanks to those that I have served with the past 3 years, I appreciate each of you and thank you for sharing your gifts with me. As I reflect on receiving that phone call 3 years ago from Pastor Kendall asking if I would be willing to serve on Council, I was both honored and humbled by this call. # **Church Council Secretary's Report**

The Church Council meets every month in Conference Room One or Two. These meetings are God-led and reliant on the Holy Spirit's and Scripture's guidance, as we do the work of the church. Every meeting starts with quiet reflection, prayer, and a review of LOC's mission statement. Answered prayers are shared and each month a different council member prepares a devotion to reflect on. Secretary's and Treasurer's reports are presented and accepted and any updates with the pre-school are discussed.



Working sessions include ministry updates and updates on the growing online ministry as we continue to grow into one church in two spaces, both in-person and

online. Other initiatives worked on this year include the Memorial Garden, the Endowment Fund, additional serving opportunities, and the continuation of the Ignite Initiative, which has allowed LOC to continue to Invite, Nurture, and Serve.

Learning time was added to this year's council meetings. Council members read two books: <u>The Volunteer Church</u> and <u>Canoeing the Mountains</u>. These books were valuable for Council members to read to gain insight on effective recruiting, coaching, and rewarding of volunteers, as well as leading in a changing world through uncharted territory. Every month there was an opportunity to share key takeaways from the books, reinforcing what LOC has been doing well and inspiring ideas for the future.

As we joyfully reflect on the past year, it is with immense excitement and gratitude that we present to you our Annual Report for our beloved Children's Ministry. In the heart of our community, where laughter echoes and little feet pitter-patter, we've witnessed a kaleidoscope of growth, love, and discovery. FaithLand Sunday School at our 9am and 10:30am services have become the vibrant heartbeat of our Children's Ministry, where young minds come alive with curiosity and enthusiasm. Guided by our passionate leaders, these young hearts delved into a world of faith, friendship, and fun. From engaging Bible stories to lively music and creative crafts, each day unfolded as an adventure of discovery. The energy was palpable as the children explored the foundations of their faith, forging bonds with their peers and mentors alike. Underneath the summer sun, this gathering became a joyful tapestry of learning, growing, and creating cherished memories that will last a lifetime.



The heartbeat of our Children's Ministry has quickened with the resounding success and growth of our mid-week programming, where over 100 eager young minds now gather each week. # **Youth Ministries**

#### MIDDLE SCHOOL MINISTRY

**PATH Job Changes:** Jared Skorburg who served faithfully for 12 years as the PATH Manger, retired in February. In May at our celebration, he came back, and we celebrated his 12 years of leadership. In May, Candice (Candi) Neely accepted the position as the PATH Director and is doing a fantastic job in the ministry.

**PATH Confirmation Ministry:** 2023-2024: 76 students, 34 leaders. School year enrollment for PATH 2022-2023 was 69 students accompanied by 34 leaders. The volunteer administrative team helps with check-in and with recording worship reflections and serving reflections. Our lessons are from Orange Curriculum. A teaching team was assembled where former PATH leaders, current PATH leaders, and LOC congregants taught some of the lessons. Pastor Mo, Pastor Kendall, Jared, Kim, and Candi also taught throughout the year.



**PATH Retreat 2023:** 54 students and 35 leaders attended this annual weekend retreat that was held at Lake Geneva Youth Camp. The theme was "Ascend: Rise Up, Made New", based on Colossians 3:2a. It was a powerful weekend where we looked at how the Lord's Prayer can help us to stand up and become a new person.

**PATH Serving Events:** During the year, the PATH students assisted with Saturday Serves for LOC, making Angel Tree Ornaments, and Operation Christmas Child. Though out the fall small groups served in many ways,

making cards for nursing homes, yard clean-up for LOC families, donating coats, park clean ups, and food scavenger hunts.



**PATH BASH**: 94 students and leaders participated in an afternoon serving in different ways in the community, games at Randall Oaks, and worship at LOC. Kim Carrera taught the lesson that night on letting go of our idols and the things that hold us back from following God completely.

**Rite of Affirmation of Baptism:** Following Faith Expression presentations, 17 8<sup>th</sup> graders affirmed their baptism at confirmation services in May.



**Summer JAM:** An average of 27 middle school age students attended. This summer Ryan Holmer stepped into the role of Summer JAM Coordinator. He along with Kim Carrera and several high school assistants led the weekly devotions, games, and activities to strengthen spiritual growth. We had special nacho cheese nights, a water battle, a special Mission Impossible event, and we ended the summer with a color run battle.

#### **HIGH SCHOOL MINISTRY**

**Summit Youth Group:** Summit had attendance of 30 high schoolers for 2023. Summit has 8 adult leaders. We are using a curriculum from GROW. Some of the series talked about the importance of celebrating how God made us all distinct, having good habits can help grow our relationship with God, and the importance of forgiveness. We added in movie discussion nights where we watched a movie and then talked about the important issues it showed.

**Bible Study:** Sunday afternoon Bible Study is a place, where teens plunge deeper into their faith. Throughout 2023 they looked at a series on courage, book of Revelation, and recently started a series on the Enneagram, The Road Back to You. Kim Carrera is the main teacher along with some student-led weeks.

Winter Retreat 2023: In February, 30 students and leaders went to Lake Geneva Youth Camp in Lake Geneva, Wisconsin for a weekend retreat. The theme of the weekend was "KINISI" which is Greek for movement. They grew in their faith as they learned the importance of moving along in their faith. It was a powerful weekend where people for the first time decided to dedicate their lives to Christ and were some rededicated to Christ.



**Mission Trip:** 40 high school students and adult leaders went to Benton Harbor, MI and partnered with YouthWorks. The theme for the week of serving was "You Are Here". One of the main scriptures for the week was from Matthew 25:14-30. Throughout the week we saw many people using their gifts and talents that the Lord has given them. They were split into multiple work crews as they served the community of Benton Harbor. They served in many ways with some serving at local gardens, at Project Need where they take run down home and repurpose them for affordable living, Habitat for Humanity, resale shops, and cleaning and repairing all over the community. 46 people were God's hands and

feet as they were learning to love EVERYONE authentically. Three youth and Kim Carrera shared in the weekend worship message focused on the serving that was done and life transformation experienced. The students also led music for the LOC congregation the weekend of the mission trip worship message.



**Summer Summit:** We spent this summer connecting through fellowship and some fun events. In May, we welcomed the 8<sup>th</sup> graders to Summit at a Pizza event. Over the summer we did some fun things like a movie night, pool party, Funway in Batavia (we even invited the soon to be 8<sup>th</sup> graders), and a special worship night where we prayed over the college students who were heading off. We spent our Thursdays having Froyo Thursdays or Thursday lunches, it was just a time to get together during the week and fellowship over food. As summer was ending, we had a Lock-in where 30 high school students and some leaders enjoyed a night of fun with no sleep. Two former Summit students planned and lead the night.



**Serving Joyfully:** During the course of the year, Summit has found some fun ways to serve. We have been partnering with FISH Food Pantry in Carpentersville and serve at their location every 2-3 months. A handle full of our students also serve at LOC helping with the children's choir and on the Sunday worship team.

## **Welcome Ministry Report**

It is with great intentionality that the 134 members of the Welcome Team sign up to serve at every worship and special service - they genuinely care about providing exceptional hospitality to others that they might experience God.

The Welcome Team continues to expand and add new members each and every year, and 2023 has been no exception. I am beyond humbled and grateful for the faithful service of this team and its leaders - who provide outstanding hospitality on a weekly basis. If there's a need - they fill it. No service goes unstaffed or unattended. They consistently show up, week after week, and give the best of themselves to others.

We also had another exciting year meeting new attendees and worshipers through our Meet the Pastors, Pizza with the Pastors and Membership Classes. It is always encouraging to hear how God is working in the lives of those He brings to Light of Christ. We have had over 56 people become new members this year! Welcome to the Light of Christ Family!

The Welcome Center coffee experience continues to support the IntoKenya Mission, a 501c3 organization headed up by members of our congregation. Make sure to stop by the IntoKenya table when they set up in the Welcome Center 3-4 times a year. This is a great way to see how our support of this mission is directly impacting the lives of orphans and children in the Irechelo Village in Kakamenga, Kenya. You'll be able to see and hear about the ways God is using you to change lives. They even made a trip back to Kenya this past November - and would be happy to share new pictures and stories with you!



## **Worship and Music Ministries Report**

#### Worship

In 2023, Light of Christ continued to create meaningful worship experiences with regular collaboration between the pastors, staff, Worship Band Team, Production Team, Welcome Team, Children's Choir, Altar Care Team, and Scripture Readers Team.

We continued to offer worship services on Sunday mornings at 9am and 10:30am that include a preaching pastor, a presiding pastor, and a worship band playing contemporary worship songs and hymns. We were able to include Children's Choir in worship regularly throughout 2023.

The worship ministry is blessed with a full complement of musicians in our worship bands, involving about 35 people, including a few new additions! This year's Christmas Eve 10pm worship service utilized a chamber wind ensemble.

Unique elements were included in a few worship series to add creativity and create a fresh experience for worshipers. For example, the 7-week "Busy" series included a new opening sequence with responsive prayer and video reflections, and the Advent series integrated new decorative elements on the worship platform and added short bumper videos to set up sermons.

In 2023, Light of Christ ended the Saturday 5:00p worship service. We are thankful for how that service was a blessing to our community for so long.

We continue to use Planning Center Online Services software to incorporate all worship ministries in a single location for worship scheduling and planning.

We are still living into our calling to be "one church in two locations" – 1700 Longmeadow and online. This means an ongoing commitment to a worship experience for our congregants whose primary means of engagement is online.



#### **Production Team**

The heartbeat of Light of Christ Church's Production Team resonates with a commitment to effectively convey the message and worship music across various mediums, such as YouTube, Facebook, LOC Website, and the TVs in our building. Operating behind the scenes, our team dedicates itself to ensuring a seamless blend of sound, lighting, and visuals to create an immersive and distraction-free experience. Our mission is simple: when attendees gather on Sunday mornings, either in-person or through livestream, we aim to foster engagement and connectivity.

Within our diverse team, members are trained and specialize in Live Sound, ProPresenter (Projection), Camera Operation, Broadcast Mixing, Stage Lighting, Event Planning, and Logistics. This multi-faceted skill set empowers us to deliver the highest quality, where every detail is meticulously curated to enhance the overall worship environment.

Throughout the past year, our team diligently refined production workflows and invested in comprehensive training programs. This dedication resulted in a notable elevation of our production quality. Again, this year, we received some generous contributions, which helped us to acquire and install new movable (rotating) light fixtures, significantly enhancing the visual ambiance on our platform and floor.

The Production Team at LOC extends its services beyond the realm of weekly services. In 2023, we actively participated in a myriad of church functions and ministries, including but not limited to the First Communion Workshop, Faith Expressions, Path Events, Summit Events, Wednesday Night Live, Children's Choir Musicals, Women's and Men's Events, Immersion Baptisms, Memorials, Weddings, Preschool Graduation, Theater Camp, VBS, Breakfast with Baby Jesus, and more. This diversification showcases our team's adaptability and eagerness to support the broader mission of LOC.

Shepherd of the Prairie Lutheran Church – Huntley, One Hope Church- Lake in the Hills, and Church on the Rock –



Huntley joined us for an incredible day of inspiring talks given by speakers from each church, including our own Pastor Kendall Koenig and in-depth conversations within small groups.

#### **Connections Fun:**

The Men's Ministry team continued to invite men in for community-building events like the **Men's Kick-off BBQ and Bags Tournament**, which continues to be a great success every year, and **Dad's and Kid's Pancake and Painting Breakfast** delights dads and their kids while bonding over their pancake and painting creations.

#### WOMEN'S MINISTRY

**Girl's Night In**, formerly known as IF Table, gathers for various activities the second Thursday evening of every month – September through May. The name change was to reflect its purpose, which is to invite women to spend an evening "in" at Light of Christ for connections with each other and to grow their faith.

In October of 2023, the women's leadership team experienced great success in hosting a **"Blessings Shower"** for Refuge for Women (RFW). Ladies from LOC and the community gathered to hear an amazing presentation from Meredith Hodge, director of RFW. They showered the female residents who were rescued from Human Trafficking with many gifts. 50 women attended, and more than 50



gifts were donated. Women were so incredibly generous and kind, wanting to give gifts even when unable to attend the event in person.



#### Women's One Day Event

On Saturday, November 11, 2023, 72 women gathered for the Event "Ordinary to Extraordinary." Light of Christ, God wants to reveal the extraordinary in each of us. Speakers gave impactful messages that tied in this theme with Identity, Anxiety, and Living in the Extraordinary Love of Christ. Great connections

were made throughout the day, while sharing a meal, in small groups, while worshipping, or during a fun rock painting activity. It was a day of many blessings.



#### **Connections Fun:**

There were several fun activities for the women of LOC. A relaxing afternoon in June was spent at **The Prairie State Winery,** with live music and wine tasting. It was well attended and loads of fun. In July, ladies gathered for an **Eagles Band Tribute** at the Algonquin Picnic in the Park. **The Tea Party Kickoff** event in September hosted 50 women enjoying a lovely afternoon of sipping tea served with delicious tea sandwiches

#### **COUPLES MINISTRY**

**Algonquin-Lake in the Hills Food Pantry:** Eighteen faithful servants from Light of Christ volunteer at the Algonquin-Lake in the Hills Food Pantry every Monday morning to help add new food deliveries from local grocers to the pantry's inventory. Much preparation with weighing in the food, restocking shelves, organizing, and cleaning the pantry so when guests arrive to shop on Tuesday, everything is in good order for them. Algonquin-Lake in the Hills Food Pantry continues to bless our community, as 2023 was another year of difficult financial challenges for many more families.



**Corn Ministry:** On Sunday, September 10<sup>th</sup>, yet another wonderful blessing occurred when Local farmer Dan Fruin gave a generous donation of ¼ acre of fresh corn to be picked and transported to the FISH Pantry in Carpentersville. We eagerly anticipate involving youth in the corn harvesting process in the fall of 2024.

**Golden Diners:** Light of Christ Church partners with Catholic Charities to deliver meals to elderly or disabled individuals in the Algonquin Area. 17 LOC volunteers participate in a delivery rotation alongside other local organizations, ensuring that these individuals receive a nourishing, wholesome, and warm meal each day.

**Branching out Tutoring:** Branching Out Tutoring remains an invaluable blessing to the community, extending educational assistance to students with financial needs from local schools. Adult tutors from Light of Christ Church generously provide their time and support, making tutoring services available on Tuesdays and Thursdays.




**Replanted:** LOC offers support and encouragement to adoptive, foster, and safe families through Replanted, a faith-based ministry.

Servants Out Serving (SOS) Ministry: As SOS embarked on its second year of ministry, it was actively engaged in



planning numerous serving and giving opportunities at Light of Christ. The ministry effectively coordinated and conducted another **LOC Mobile Food Pantry** in September, catering to 132 families from the Fox Valley Area. This marked a significant increase, doubling the number of families served compared to the previous year. **The Turkey Drive** collected 124 turkeys and additional Thanksgiving food items, for a total of 2,300 pounds of food. The FISH food pantry board members were surprised and elated.

With the growth of the SOS Ministry, its impact was broadened by initiating the first **LOC Backpack Drive**. A total of 135 backpacks were distributed to children from Kindergarten through High School, equipped with the essential supplies to ensure a successful beginning to their new academic year.

ASP Appalachia Service Project: 28 men and women from Light of Christ Church packed their bags and headed to Appalachia, dedicating a week to working on homes in the area. These dedicated individuals undertake crucial repairs on homes and properties, all while fostering meaningful connections with the residents. Members of the ministry serving team openly expressed their heartfelt and emotional experiences as they engaged in their work, feeling blessed to form connections with the families they served.

At Light of Christ Preschool, we celebrate God's love for all children. Established in 1991, the school's primary mission is to instill a love of learning in each student. Children in our preschool are actively involved in a curriculum that stresses the social, emotional, physical, and academic aspects of their development. We have a wonderful staff of teachers that create a warm and accepting environment, which supports the development of the whole child.



I have entered my third year at LOC Preschool as director, and we are having a great start to the 2023-2024 school year. Currently, we have two 4-year-old, three 3-year-old, and two 2-year-old classes with over 100 students. Next year we plan on adding a third 4year-old class. We have a great reputation in the community and our enrollment shows the positive effects of that reputation.

Throughout the year we host Special Events to stay engaged and connected to our families. These include - *Dads, Dudes, and Donuts* in September, *Fall Festival* in October, *Christmas Sing and Breakfast with Baby Jesus* in December, *Moms and Muffins* in February, *Grandparent's Day* in March, and *Spring Sing* in April. LOC Preschool also participated in a community service project. Before Thanksgiving we collected food for the D300 Food Pantry. Our families are so generous, we had two cars full of food donations. The D300 food pantry directly serves the families in our community.





We are excited to start registration for the 2024-2025 school year. Starting on February 1<sup>st</sup> registration opens for church members, February 5<sup>th</sup> for current preschool families, and on February 12<sup>th</sup> registration opens to the community. Each new school year gives us the opportunity to welcome new students into our building and to continue to teach and serve our current families. The teachers and I look forward to ending the school year strong with lots of happy preschoolers!
